- occupational disease is the fourth leading cause of death in New York State?
- exposures to asbestos, chemicals, solvents, dust, metals, or radiation can cause adverse health affects?
- hazards can exist in all types of workplaces, from schools and factories to hospitals and offices?
- repetitive tasks such as typing or assembly work can cause muscular or skeletal pain?
- work-related symptoms often diminish outside the workplace on days off and vacations?

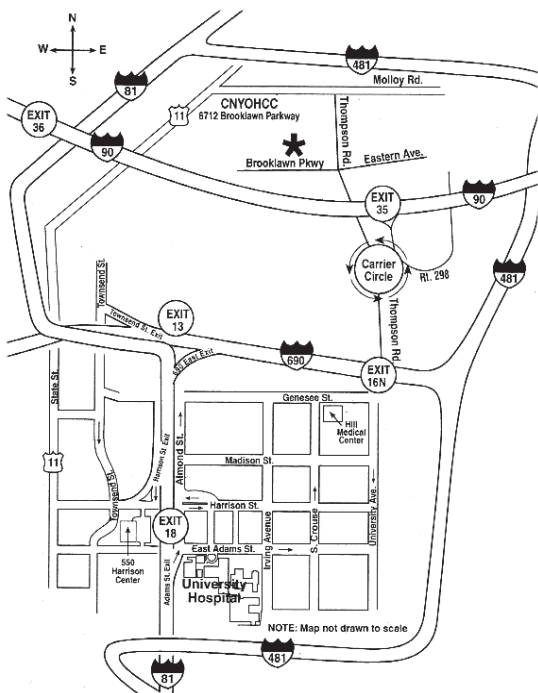

# About CNYOHCC

The CNYOHCC, established through a New York State Department of Health grant awarded to the SUNY Health Science Center through the Department of Preventive Medicine, is one of a network of eight occupational health clinical centers established throughout the state.

This project was developed as a result of the growing recognition of disease resulting from exposure to hazards in the workplace and the need for physician specialists and other health care providers trained in occupational medicine to thoroughly evaluate and diagnose work-related diseases.

An advisory board made up of representatives from labor groups, business organizations, academic institutions, professional groups, governmental agencies, and other groups concerned with worker health and safety provides consultation and guidance regarding CNYOHCC programs and policies.
