Excused Absences from Scheduled Exams: All requests must be made to the Chair of the CCC-1 for Year 1 (Dr. Thomas Poole) or CCC-2 for Year 2 (Dr. Chaitanya Haldipur); students are NOT to contact individual course directors. If contacted, course directors will immediately refer students to the CCC-1 or CCC-2 Chair. A signed letter explaining the reason for the request should be submitted by the student to the Chair prior to the exam date. The Chair will generally excuse the student from the scheduled exam for any of the following reasons:

- Participation in a major religious observance that conflicts with an exam date (with the Chair to be guided by the Office of Student Affairs in deciding which religious observances qualify);
- Attendance at a funeral service for a member of the student's immediate family (1st and 2nd degree relations);
- Incapacitating illness or injury (with an explanatory note from a physician);
- Hospitalization (automatic).
