At the APEX of the AAP



The Crier learned through Dr. Welch's newsletter that our very own Mide Ajagbe has been accepted into the 2018-2019 APEX (Advancing Pediatric Educator

eXcellence) Program. The APEX Teaching Program is co-sponsored by the American Academy of Pediatrics Section on Hospital Medicine and the Academic Pediatric Association and endorsed by the Society of Hospital Medicine Pediatric Committee. APEX is a unique, longitudinal national program that offers learning opportunities which foster an ongoing exchange of ideas and best practices. Participants learn educational theory and specific skills they will apply at their home institution with direct observation of teaching by a local mentor. Under the guidance of expert faculty, they will also build a cohort of educators from institutions across the country and together develop educational workshops for national presentation. Previous cohorts have had over a dozen workshops accepted at national meetings, including the annual Pediatric Hospital Medicine (PHM) conference. Entry into the program is through a competitive process so we are very proud that one of our very

own hospitalists, Dr. Ajagbe, has been accepted. Mide tells the Crier, "I am grateful and honored to have been selected for this." Congratulations, Mide!

Wednesday was a special trip to the multisensory room with Clare Arezina in addition to the breakfast, cake, and gifts provided by the GME office. Thursday was



Weds, March 7th, 1:00 - 6:00 PM, New Academic Building 4414BC


