As a reminder, all active members of the medical staff are mandated to review and attest to the education sent via email. As a reminder this education **must be completed by January 31, 2017**. *Non compliance with this mandatory education will put your membership on the Upstate Medical Staff in jeopardy.*

UPDATES TO ALERTS AND ADVISORIES-Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate action.

INFORMATIONAL MESSAGE-Provides timely information, important for review or serves as a reminder for an action that should be taken.
