Workplace Violence Definition

 Violent acts, including physical assaults and threats of assaults directed toward persons in the work setting

• This includes all members of the Upstate Community including employees, volunteers, contractors, students, patients and visitors

Types of Workplace Violence



- Violence by strangers
- Violence by customers or clients
- Violence by co-workers
- Violence by personal relations

Workplace Violence Includes

- Use of force with the intent to cause harm
- Physical attack
- Unwanted contact
- Hitting
- Fighting
- Being sworn or shouted at

- Pushing
- Throwing Objects
- Harassment of any nature
- Verbal threats
- Written threats
- Psychological trauma
- Intimidation

Factors that Increase the Risk

Violence may occur anywhere in the Upstate Campus – the most frequent likely areas include:

- Areas with contact to the public
- Areas with late night or early morning hours
- Emergency rooms
- Poorly-lighted parking areas
- Uncontrolled access to the workplace
- Areas where money is exchanged with the public

Indicators to Recognize

Direct or in-direct threats of harm

- Extreme change in behavior
- Extreme moodiness, depression, withdrawal, social isolation
- Inappropriate and aggressive behavior
- Talking about violent acts
- Increased fascination with weapons
- Forgetfulness/inability to concentrate
- Acts of self harm



Practical Tips to Staying Safe

- Know the emergency exits
- Always lock away valuables
- Check elevator for suspicious people before entering
- Never hold open locked or controlled access doors for others
- Be aware by paying attention to your surroundings
- Report any suspicious activity
- If you feel unsafe call University Police

Working Late Practical Tips

- Keep emergency numbers handy
- Lock office door when alone
- Tell someone where you are
- Keep cell phone charged, on and ready for use
- Get escort to car or use buddy system
- Lock car door when leaving
- Have car key ready
- Park under lights
- Program ICE into phone
