Student Learning Outcomes Assessment & Program Evaluation Plan

## KEY:

Exposure Level (E) = Students reflect on professional self-identity and gain knowledge about the value of interprofessional work. Experience enables student to meet and get to know other health professionals. Student opportunity to "work" alongside other health professionals (parallel play). Students develop an understanding of various differences/similarities in roles and patient/project/research goals. Exposure level experiences may include: co-learning,small group discussions, and/or service learning.

Immersion Level (I) = Students work together on a project or patient care team where there is an opportunity to function as team member or leader. Students develop skills in leadership and teamwork. Students practice communicating with patients as part of a team. Immersion level experiences may include: simulations, QI projects, collaborative care opportunities, community projects, and/or research.

Team Readiness (TR) = Students perform as supportive members and/or leaders of teams. Students can clearly articulate their roles and responsibilities as well as those of other health care providers. Students provide creative insights to improve teamwork. Experiences may include student demonstration of leadership - in research or patient care, simulation, and/or services as a team player.

Values/Ethics: Work with individuals of other professions to maintain a climate of mutual respect and shared values. (3,4)

Roles/Responsibilities: Use the knowledge of one's own role and those of other professions to appropriately assess and address the health care needs of patients and to promote and advance the health of populations. (1, 3)

Interprofessional Communication: Communicate with patients, families, and professionals in health and other fields in a responsive and responsible manner

that supports a team approach to the promotion and maintenance of health and the prevention and treatment of disease. (2,4)

Teams & Teamwork: Apply relationship building values and the principles of team dynamics to perform effectively in different teams roles to plan, deliver, and evaluate patient/population-centered care and population health programs and policies that are safe, timely, efficient, effective, and equitable. (1,2,3,4)
