IPE Benchmark Survey Report

The results are in!

This spring, we sent surveys to faculty, staff, and students to help us establish a benchmark on Upstate's opinion regarding interprofessional and team approaches to health care (A special thank you to **Lauren Germain** who helped develop the survey). Our objective was to understand where we are today with IPE and then provide learning interventions that help to develop competencies for all of us.

We received a total of **280** responses. The reporting below provides us with an initial glimpse, but does not yet provide the full context within and across disciplines. It should be viewed only as a starting point. As we move forward, we will uncover more meaning and find where we can make the greatest impact. By the numbers:



- The College of Medicine accounted for **57%** of all student responses, and accounted for **72%** of all faculty/staff responses.
- 200 people responded on a scale of 0-100, to the following question, "In general, how important do you feel Interprofessional education/share learning is to health care education?"
 The average score was 79.
- **91%** of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that "The team approach improves the quality of care to patients." while only **46%** agreed or strongly agreed that, "Health professionals working on teams are more responsive than others to the emotional and financial needs of patients."
- **73%** of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that "The give and take among team members helps them make better patient care decisions."
- 59% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that, "The team approach makes the delivery of care more efficient."
- **75%** of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that "Having to report observations to the team helps team members better understand the work of other health professionals."
- 8% agreed or strongly agreed that "Developing an interdisciplinary patient care plan is excessively time consuming."
- 75% of 229 people responded that they had worked in an Interprofessional group within the past month. Nearly half (48%) indicated they had done so on at least four occasions.
 - **23%** had done so 11 times or more.
- 77% of respondents noted they had practiced in acute care and 72% in outpatient care.
- **45%** of all respondents indicated that they had participated in Interprofessional Education workshops provided through Upstate Medical University. Of those that had attended workshops, **78%** had attended one to two sessions.
- **16%** of all respondents had facilitated IPE workshops through Upstate Medical University. Of those who facilitated IPE workshops, **82%** had facilitated one to two sessions.

New IPE Programs

Upstate 101: Foundations of Teamwork

In order to provide a foundational learning experience for incoming College of Health Professions and College of Medicine students, one that will help set the tone for professionalism and teamwork as they begin their academic career with us, we have developed a workshop for Wednesday, August 30, 2017. The workshop will run for 2 hours between 4pm-6pm (3pm-6pm for Facilitators) in the 4th floor of the New Academic Building.

With nearly 200 students participating from the College of Health Professions along with \sim 200 from the College of Medicine (including MPH students), we have the rare opportunity to address this incoming group synchronously.

The objectives for the event are:

- Promote a formative, professional, and team-based approach to healthcare learning at Upstate Medical University
- To provide interdisciplinary introductions between new students

<u>HOW YOU CAN HELP</u>: Faculty and Clinicians interested in serving as small group facilitators are encouraged to email Darren at <u>carbonid@upstate.edu</u>. Facilitators will be required to attend a one-time, pre-event workshop from 3pm-4pm on August 30. Remaining slots are limited.

Virtual Medical Error Room Session (VMER)

To enhance the VMER session, a core component of the Practice of Medicine course, an IPE Student Leader group developed a proposal for the content and format of the VMER experience based on their own experience with the program. The program will combine video, small group, and whole class discussion for several participating disciplines.

The objectives for the event are:

- Students will share their unique roles and perspectives in the health care team.
- Students will demonstrate how working together and integrating the entire health care team creates the safest, highest quality environment for our patients.
- Students will identify safety and communication concerns with their health care team.

Student members of the team leading the work to enhance the program are: Jennifer James (Respiratory Therapy); Rebecca Mesmer (Nursing); Jeremy Skiechs (Physician's Assistant); Alyssa Tamburrino (Physical Therapy); and James Mattson, Claire Triller, and Leanne Grafmuller (all of Medicine).
