Proceeds will be used for two Prehospital Trauma Life Support courses for advanced level EMS Providers and First Responders who serve those regions covered by Upstate's Trauma and Burn services.

The Clark Burn Center is a . comprehensive center for excellence in adult and pediatric inpatient and outpatient care. It is the region's only burn center, serving nearly half of New York state and providing services to 40 counties. The center will use proceeds to purchase items. such as CD players, iPods, tablets and hidden mirrors, to aid in the emotional and mental recovery process for burn patients.

Since its inception in 1999, Mystery, Malt and Merlot has provided more than \$380,000 to support healthcare and scholarships at Upstate Medical University.




# **Snowflake Central**
