2021 Year-End Campaign & Valentine's Day drawing raise nearly \$6,000



Advocates for Upstate's **2021 Year-End Campaign**, which ended Dec. 31, raised nearly \$5,500, in

large part due to a generous donation by C&S Foundation, Inc.

Proceeds from the campaign go toward the Advocates' Nellie Hurley Scholarship Program that benefits qualifying Upstate Medical University employees and adult volunteers who are pursuing undergraduate degrees in the health professions.

Congratulations to Dana Savici, MD, and to Theresa Devennie, winners of our 2021 Year-End Campaign gift baskets.

The Advocates' Grants Program benefited from \$405 raised through the organization's **Valentine's Day drawing** that also resulted in two additional \$100 donations to our organization. The Advocates annually awards grants to benefit Upstate's patient care, patient education and staff enrichment programs. Congratulations to Lynn Scott who was randomly se-

lected as the winner of the gift basket that included chocolates, gift certificates to Francesca's Cuccina Restaurant and Westcott Florist, and more.

Advocates grant helps children of adult patients



Allison Della Penna is very grateful for the Advocates grant in support of the COAP (Children of Adult Patients) program.

The Certified Child Life Specialist with the Pediatric Burn Clinic described the help the grant made possible for nine-year

old and seven-year old children whose mother was hospitalized with severe burns over the holidays. For more than three weeks the children could not visit their mother.

COAP supported virtual visits, paid for dolls with the same dressings as Mom had so her children

could be prepared for when she came home, paid for voice recorders with messages from Mom placed inside stuffed animals, bought books to help kids process scary things happening to their caregivers such as "A Terrible Thing Happened."

"COAP, and Advocates support, bridges the gap where these children weren't previously getting this level of support," says Della Penna. She hopes the program will expand beyond burn patients.

The Advocates Grants Committee is evaluating the 2022-23 proposals this spring and the awards will be listed in the next Advocates newsletter and on the Advocates website at upstate.edu/advocates.

The COVID-19 pandemic has seriously impacted blood collections, including at Upstate. With the help of Advocates and Upstate medical student volunteers, the January drives at Upstate University Hospital and Upstate Community Hospital exceeded the goals set by the local American Red Cross office. The drive downtown collected 76 units, almost

50 percent above goal while the drive at Community saw 28 units collected, almost 60 percent above goal.

American Red Cross Senior Account Manager Katie Stepanian said "we are very grateful to all at SUNY Upstate for answering the call and for your continued partnership and support."

Advocates Administrative Coordinator Jonathan Adler dressed as "Blood Drop" and was joined by medical student Abhishek Doshi to recruit donors preceding the January drives.
