




Graduation and Retention Data by Matriculation Year


As Doctoral programs typically take more than 4 years, graduation and persistence rates have been combined and labeled as 'Retention Rates' in the graphs below. Rates are based on 2016 Fall enrollment data. All data are calculated at 150% time to degree.

Publication

Doctoral students in the College of Graduate Studies who finished in 2011-2012, 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 published on average 4.4 publications (with 2.1 being first author) that are indexed on Pub Med. On average, these publications have been cited 26 times.¹

Employment or placement after graduation

In-Field Employment Rates (PhD, MS)

Residency Matching Rates (MD/PhD)

100% (or 8 out of 8) of the graduates from the MD/PhD program from 2013, 2014 and 2015 were matched into residencies.
