


Graduation and Retention Data¹ by Matriculation Year











Performance on Licensing and Certification Exams

All Masters' program graduates are eligible to sit for their national specialty certification exam. However, national certification is not required for licensure as a Nurse Practitioner in New York State, which is a disincentive for many graduates who often delay taking the national certification exam soon after graduation, if at all. This reduces the value of this as a measure of program achievement.










Pediatric Nurse Practitioner (PNP) - Pediatric Nursing Certification Board
