Radiation Therapy <i>Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy or Bachelor of Professional Studies in Radiation Therapy</i>	Treat cancer and other diseases in patients by administering radiation treatments
Medical Imaging <i>Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging Sciences or Bachelor of Professional Studies in Medical Imaging</i>	Use X-ray, Cat Scan, Sonogram and other technology to reveal injuries, illnesses
Medical Technology/ Medical Biotechnology <i>Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology or Bachelor of Science in Medical Biotechnology</i>	Use high tech equipment to help in diagnoses using blood and other samples

Physician <i>Medical Doctor (MD)</i>	Diagnose, treat and prescribe health care
Physical Therapy <i>Doctor of Physical Therapy</i>	Help patients overcome physical injuries and disabilities
Nurse Practitioner <i>Doctor of Nursing Practice</i>	Designs, applies and evaluates research and generates evidence to promote safe, effective and equitable patient care
