How important are away electives? Acting Internships?	Away electives are commonly done and in addition to showing interest they help the candidate get a better feel for the specialty.	
If students did well on Step 1, should they try to take Step 2 before Rank Order Lists are due?	Most applicants seem to take Step 2 early.	
Should letters of recommendations all come from this specialty or should also have others?	Both are acceptable, however prefer at least 2 letters from Radiation Oncologists
