SUNY Upstate Medical University, Department of Emergency Medicine, EMS Education & the Upstate Foundation are pleased to announce the **2022 Critical Care Transport Development Grant**. This one-time award is intended to provide financial assistance to a local EMS agency to develop critical care transport capabilities, thereby improving access to health care system across our 14-county region. It is the intent that the local EMS agency becomes self-sufficient develops capabilities for critical care transport while not relying on outside support for necessary equipment or personnel.

Two awards of \$12,500 will be available. Funding granted based on demonstrated need and community impact. Agencies must agree to support matching funds, 25% of their total award

Grant applications must identify:

- Community Served
- Demonstrated Need for Funds
- Budget
  - Equipment, Training, Personnel
- Funding stream for matching funds
- Implementation timeline
- Sustainability plan

Letters of support are required from the following:

- Agency Medical Director
- Affiliated Hospitals

Applicants must articulate how this new program will impact their agency and improve health care for the communities served.

Eligible EMS agencies must have a base of operations and provide service within our 14-county region: Broome, Cayuga, Chenango, Cortland, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Madison, Oneida, Onondaga, Oswego, Tioga, Tompkins, St. Lawrence

Applications must be submitted as a single PDF document to Douglas Sandbrook by July 1, 2022.
