

Provider Wellness Task Force News

The Provider Well-Being Task Force has been working to understand the contributors to burnout at Upstate and has recommended interventions to address them. Identified projects include:

- The Well-Being Index (WBI) is an anonymous 7-9 item questionnaire developed by the Mayo Clinic. Consider checking in at <u>www.mywellbeingindex.org/signup</u> The invitation code is "Upstate." The contract is renewed for another year.
- The Clinical Collaboration Center ("The Cube") is a planned place for social connections to promote provider collaborations. A space has been identified and will be developed.
- Voice-To-Text in EPIC: Physicians cite EHRs as the top factor contributing to stress. Voice-to-text is coming; efforts are underway to improve EHR usability.
- Chief Well-being Officer (CWO): A call for an assistant dean for well-being has been made (please contact Chris Liberty, if interested). Look for a call for a hospital Chief Well-being Officer soon.

- Check with your department administrator regarding letter requests
- Submit your packet at least one week prior to the due date for pre-review

Faculty Standpoint Survey

Last May, all full- and part-time faculty members were invited to take part in the StandPoint Faculty Engagement Survey administered by the AAMC. The results are now being reviewed by faculty, including benchmarks of our faculty engagement levels with peer institutions. Consider attending the **AAMC webinar on January 29th at noon in the WSK Alumni Auditorium**, where you will have the opportunity to hear a presentation of COM results from AAMC staff and to ask questions. The AAMC StandPoint Survey results for the COM suggest three priority areas for further analysis. Consider the opportunity to effect positive change through participation in a review group of one of the following priority areas:

- 1. Medical school governance (transparency, communication, faculty engagement)
- 2. Workforce Culture (innovation, research)
- 3. Recruitment and retention (diversity and inclusion issues)

If you are interested in Priority #1, please contact Dr. **Joe Stein.** This Priority group is an extension of the MCA Faculty Affairs Committee. We anticipate a short turn-around with actionable deliverables. The Faculty Council Faculty Affairs committee will be reviewing Priorities 2&3. Our Featured Colleague Award

Congratulations ~ Deborah Young Bradshaw, MD, FAAN!

Dr. Deborah Bradshaw, Professor of Neurology, Associate Chair for Medical Education and Residency Program director in the Department of Neurology was recently elected to serve as a member of the Neurology Residency Review Committee (RRC). The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (**ACGME**) oversees the accreditation of all medical residency programs in the US, utilizing the work of 26 different RRCs representing these specialties. The RRC establishes standards for GME, assesses residency programs, and promotes quality education. Dr. Bradshaw was nominated to the RRC by the American Academy of Neurology (AAN), where she has been very active, including her current role as Section Head, Neuromuscular Section. Advisory Committee for Residency In-service Training Examination, AAN. She won the AAN Program Director Recognition Award in 2014. The AAN nationally recognizes two Program Directors per year. In 2018, Dr. Bradshaw completed a selective 9-month leadership training program sponsored by the AAN. Dr. Bradshaw founded and implemented a novel Leadership Academy for residents in Upstate's Department of Neurology. We anticipate the Neurology RRC will greatly benefit from Dr. Bradshaw's experience and insights!
