Ann S. Botash, MD, Pediatrics, was honored (along with Martha Ryan) for her work with abused children and as a founder of the McMahon Ryan Child Advocacy Center at the “Kick-off for Kids” event, Oct. 24, 2013.

Sharon Brangman, MD, Medicine, has been selected by the Institute of Medicine (IOM) as one of a core group of seven individuals to participate in three upcoming meetings of experts on advanced dementia. IOM is convening these meetings for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the Advisory Council on Alzheimer's Research, Care, and Services that was created by the National Alzheimer's Project Act (NAPA). The first meeting was on Jan. 28, 2014 in Washington, D.C.

Joseph Himmelsbach, PhD, Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences, received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Central NY Psychological Association. During his 45 year career he developed many of the programs for the mentally ill that we now take for granted. In his roles as Deputy Director for Clinical Services and Chief of the Center for Children & Youth at Hutchings Psychiatric Center, he developed the first mobile mental health crisis service, first community housing programs, and first centralized admissions program. He also consulted with, and developed state wide training programs for, the police and sheriffs' offices to train them in working with the mentally ill. He has been and still is a faculty member at SU and Upstate where he provides excellent supervision in psychotherapy to the next generation. In later years, he became actively involved in disaster mental health and provided direct service right after 9-11 and Hurricane Katrina.

Michael Iannuzzi, MD, Chair, Medicine, has been named one of the world's top experts in the field of sarcoidosis research and treatment by Expertscape, an organization dedicated to helping consumers find health professionals with extensive expertise in their specific area of concern. Rosemary Rochford, PhD, Microbiology & Immunology, has received the International Citizen of the Year award from the International Center of Syracuse (ICS). 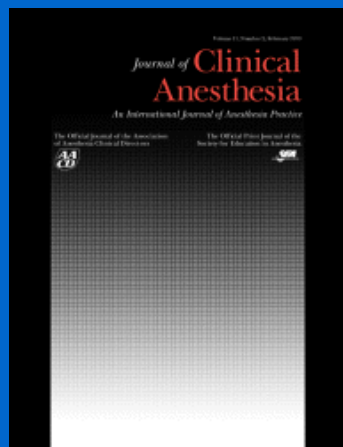

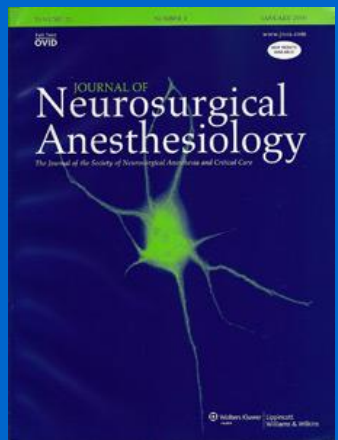

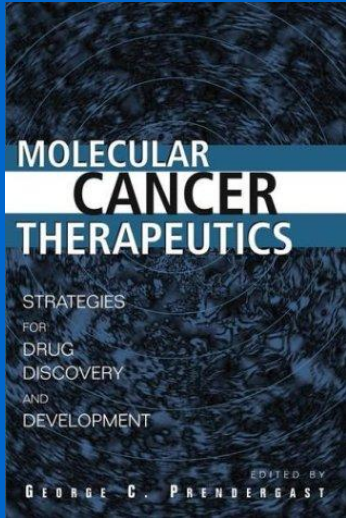

LONGITUDINAL STUDY OF CAREER CHOICES OF A SUNY-UPSTATE COHORT OF MEDICAL STUDENTS

ABSTRACT: A SUNY-UPSTATE cohort was observed during the four-year matriculation (1974-1978) of the students for changes in their career choices. Medical school exposure seemed to increase students' interest in all major specialties, with the exception of family practice. Previous reports examined the medical career choices of students at State University of New York Upstate Medical Center (SUNY-UPSTATE) in 1967, 1968, and 1972.¹⁻³ Although the 1972 survey had shown an increased interest in family practice,³ it could not be determined whether this represented a temporary trend or a true increase in interest for greater primary patient contact. It was felt that by making a longitudinal study of a single class it would be possible to evaluate whether four years of medical school experience could divert initial student interest away from family practice to other primary care specialties or vice versa.

Zinn and Held reported that, during medical school, pediatric and psychiatric specialties ranked in low students' family practice and surgery each attracted one fourth of the class and showed little change during four years at the University of Colorado. Their findings differ considerably from this study, which overlapped their report timeline; each variation might, however, be expected by result from geographical and temporal differences.

The present four-year longitudinal study of the class of 1978 cohort was begun in the fall of 1974. The career choices of the cohort were determined in each survey to monitor their changes with time. The external internship-residency (IR) appointments accepted by the cohort were obtained from the 1978 matching program prior to graduation from SUNY-UPSTATE.

METHODS

The same medical career choice questionnaire was completed in five surveys by a cohort of 87 members (78%) of the 113 members of the SUNY-
