Derek Cooney, MD, *Emergency Medicine,* was recently elected to the office of Vice-President for The Central New York EMS Council (REMSCo). Dr. Cooney is currently the only physician serving on the council and serves as a voting member and representative of Onondaga County. Dr. Cooney will serve on the Executive Committee of the Council which oversees the Regional EMS Program Agency and will assist the President in his duties as needed. He has been a member of the CNY EMS REMSCO since January of 2012. He has served on the Training and Education Committee, Policy Committee, and Bylaws Committee. Dr. Cooney also serves on the CNY EMS Regional Emergency Medical Advisor Committee (REMAC) and on the New York State Emergency Medical Services Council (SEMSCo).

Stephen V. Faraone, PhD, *Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences*, has been listed as the third most cited psychologist or psychiatrist in the world and the top cited psychologist or psychiatrist scholar in the U.S., according to Microsoft Academic Search. Dr. Faraone is professor of psychiatry, neuroscience and physiology and Director of Research for Upstate's Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. Faraone has made contributions to research in psychiatric genetics, psychopharmacology, diagnostic issues and methodology. He is principal investigator on several National Institutes of Health funded grants that address numerous psychiatric conditions, including attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), bipolar disorder and substance use disorders in children. His studies into ADHD have brought a greater understanding of the highly heritable nature of ADHD and have brought researchers closer to identifying specific genes that play a key role in increasing susceptibility to ADHD.

Christopher Fullagar, MD, *Emergency Medicine,* was awarded the 2013 CNYEMS Physician of Excellence Award by Central New York Regional Emergency Medical Services Council, Inc. on 7/16/13.
