

Most of you are probably familiar with Dr. Leah Bennett from her role in the Peds ED. But the Crier wanted to also welcome her as a member of our department and in her new role as Associate Clerkship Director. Dr. Bennett shared the following with the Crier: "Hello Pediatricians -- I am so excited to be joining the Pediatric Faculty at Upstate and particularly to have the opportunity to introduce the field we all love so much to our medical students as the new Associate Clerkship Director! I have been at Upstate as an attending in the Pediatric Emergency Department for the past 4 years and have overlapped with many of you taking care of kids here in Syracuse. As a native of Ithaca, NY, I grew up in the region, but did not spend much time in Syracuse itself until moving here. The intervening years took me all over -- from college in Maine to Central and South America for an internship with the Pan American Health Organization to Tucson, Arizona for my medical and public health training. I graduated from the Combined Pediatrics and Emergency Medicine Residency Program at the University of Arizona in 2014 and started a family during the last year of my residency. My husband (who trained in Family Medicine and Emergency Medicine) and I took our family on the road for the first few years we were out of training. Since starting at Upstate, it has been my absolute pleasure to share my love of medicine with students as an instructor for the Emergency Medicine Clerkship and as a small group facilitator for the Foundations of Reasoning in Medicine and (this year) the Patients to Populations courses. During my time off, I can usually be found outdoors somewhere with my six-year-old son Soren, four-year-old daughter Saskia and I-won't-say-how-old husband Kevin exploring the

beauty of upstate NY. If you pass us on a trail, you will know it is us if you see two tired adults trying to keep up with two blond haired kids covered in mud and babbling in a mixture of Spanish and English. We love hiking/backpacking, kayaking, skiing, cycling, rock climbing and anything else that burns off a bit of our rambunctious kids' energy. I am so excited to work with everyone through my new role with the clerkship and hope to help inspire a love and respect of pediatrics in our students!"




