Let's trust our COVID-19 Team

Each of us is exposed to a lot of information and misinformation about COVID-19 hourly. Upstate has the benefit of a robust COVID-19 team working around-the-clock to provide recommendations based on the most up-to-date scientific evidence and best practices available. Our COVID Team guidance will surely differ from some of the practices you see at other organizations and in the media. Please know that the Upstate COVID Team is basing recommendations on a thoughtful synthesis of the reliable data at hand. Let's trust our strong team, and thank them for the tireless work they are doing to keep us safe.

PAPR hoods and Goggles are in short supply

PAPRs and Goggles are critically short. These are reusable. When you finish with the PAPR hood, put it in a clear (not red) plastic bag to go distribution, who will assess them for integrity and clean them if they are suitable for reuse. Please clean goggles with a PDI wipe after use (not bleach) and reuse. Do not discard them!

Avoid Rounding in Large Groups

For the safety of our clinicians, please avoid rounding in large groups as much as possible. Divide into smaller teams. Also, limit the number of clinicians going in and out of the room of any patient with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.

COVID-19 Testing

Each of the health systems in the area is getting low on supplies for COVID-19 testing and is struggling to get more. Please **do not** perform COVID-19 screening tests on patients in whom fever or symptoms are attributable to an established or highly likely alternate diagnosis.

Inpatient Consultations

Clinicians should be judicious in their requests for inpatient and Emergency Department consultative services to avoid exposing patients and colleagues to risk from unnecessary contact or procedures. That having been said, we are not suspending consultative services in specific areas, such as the Emergency Department. Please continue to provide needed services to the Emergency Department and other areas of the hospital.

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Recommendations for Staff Responses to Exposure Risks

The following Table was developed in collaboration with ID and Infection Prevention, reflecting the information available through March 17. Recommendations for COVID-19 responses are rapidly evolving so stay tuned for updates, refinements, and modifications.
