## Pleural pH Measured by a Blood Gas Analyzer Applies to Downtown Physicians

Pleural pH Informational The Core Laboratory at Upstate University Downtown Campus will measure pleural pH by a blood gas analyzer starting on September 22, 2015. This replaces the current method of a handheld pH meter. This new method significantly improves the accuracy of the measurement.

The method provides a more accurate estimate of the pH, as it is performed under anaerobic conditions.

SPECIMEN: The pleural fluid should be drawn anaerobically in a heparinized syringe and

transported on ice or room temperature, within one (1) hour.

Minimal volume: 2 mL

TAT: (Similar to blood bases) 30 minutes, Performed 24/7

CDI Week Informational

What is a clinical Documentation Improvement Specialist (CDIS)?

CDIS at Upstate are RN's with experience in varied disciplines. They help translate and bridge the gap between CMS (Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services) technical coding terminology and the clinical language physicians use to describe the patient's condition. The most important trait of a CDI specialist is clinical knowledge since they decipher complex medical records and need to be able to recognize treatments and diagnoses that may not be clearly documented.

**ALERT**-Highest priority emergency communication; warrants immediate action or attention by the recipient.

HIGH ADVISORY-High priority does not warrant immediate action but recipients should be aware.

ADVISORY-Provides very important information for a specific incident or situation that does not require immediate action.

UPDATES TO ALERTS AND ADVISORIES. Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate action.

INFORMATIONAL MESSAGE-Provides timely information, important for review or serves as a reminder for an action that should be taken.

### CDI Goals:

- Accurately reflect the Severity of Illness with direct correlation to Risk of Mortality to improve physician and hospital profiles, increase case mix index and appreciate maximum reimbursement for resource utilization
- CDI specialists review patient medical records concurrently and assess whether all conditions and treatments are documented. When the documentation is ambiguous or conflicting, or too vague
- CDI specialists query physicians to provide clarification, further specificity or assignment of POA required for accurate coding.
