Surgical Pathology Advisory The Surgical Pathology section of the Upstate University Hospital Department of Pathology has reviewed and revised the Surgical Pathology Specimen Requisition form. Specific changes include revision of the "clinical history" section on the old form which, due to the nebulous wording, has been replaced with sections for "Reason for Procedure", "Previous Relevant Diagnosis/Other Pertinent Information", and "Specific Questions/Concerns to be Addressed". These headings are more specific are intended to improve the communication of relevant patient information from the clinician to the pathologist.

Please note, the revised requisition only applies at the Downtown campus. The revised surgical pathology paper requisition form is now available in Central Stores and on the intranet from the Pathology website as form 41610. 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### **Molecular Tests**

Applies to All Physicians At the Downtown Campus

Molecular Tests Advisory The Pathology Department has worked with Epic to create specific orders in Epic for 12 of the most common molecular tests. Since Epic went live at Upstate, the vast majority of laboratory tests orderable at Upstate labs were mapped to separate orders in Epic. This meant that a clinician who wants a CBC performed on a patient was able to enter a "CBC" order. Some tests, however, were not orderable this way. Many of our in-house molecular tests were lumped under a single generic "Test-X" order. This resulted in miscommunication, incorrect tests, and ultimately, non-ideal care for our patients. Below is a summary of the problem and solution:

In an attempt to improve this care, the information technology teams at IMT and within the pathology department have built separate orders for the most commonly ordered of the molecular tests. Below are the molecular tests which now have separate molecular test orders within Epic along with a short search phrase which will find the test:
