Applies to All Physicians

Consults Informational Following a recent review of a clinical case, in which an abnormal culture result was not followed through by the treating physicians in a timely manner, resulting in a patients ultimately death, I would like to re-emphasize the responsibilities of Attending Physicians and Consult Services as noted in the Medical Staff By-laws. The sections noted below require communication between services and documentation of an abnormal finding in a patient's medical record and proposed plan of care between physicians:

#### **MSB R-02**

## Responsibilities of the Attending Physician of Record for Patients

7. Physicians who are not the Physician of Record must report to the Attending or Resident of Record any concerns regarding a patient's condition and care while the patient is in their care: (e.g., Radiologists, Anesthesiologists, Clinical Consultants, etc.).

### **MSB R-03**

### Medical Records

8. Within 24 hours of the completion of the consult, the attending physician of record shall document in the patient's medical record his or her review of the consultation performed by the consulting service, the findings of the consulting attending physician and all resulting notes and orders.

It is with this loop closure of care provided that we will continue to provide excellent clinical care to all of our patients.

ALERT-Highest priority emergency communication; warrants immediate action or attention by the recipient.

HIGH ADVISORY-High priority does not warrant immediate action but recipients should be aware.

ADVISORY-Provides very important information for a specific incident or situation that does not require immediate action.

UPDATES TO ALERTS AND ADVISORIES-Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate action.

INFORMATIONAL MESSAGE-Provides timely information, important for review or serves as a reminder for an action that should be taken.
