Providing equitable and patient-centered care is critical to ensuring high quality care in any healthcare sector.

Dr. Li will talk about his work analyzing publicly reported patient satisfaction ratings for Maryland nursing homes from 2007-2010. Ratings were reported for overall evaluation of care, recommendation of the facility, staff performance, food, physical environment, autonomy and personal rights. While overall ratings improved during this time period, ethnic/racial minority patients continued to rate care lower.
