The second of three new faculty to join the Division of Pediatric Critical Care, Bob Newmyer started in July as our newest PICU attending. Bob was Philadelphiatrained (undergraduate at La Salle and medical school at Drexel) prior to seeking the food of Michael Simon and the near-daily snow of Cleveland, Ohio, as a pediatric resident at Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital. Now having completed his fellowship in pediatric critical care medicine at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, he comes to us looking forward to teaching and working in the areas of neurocritical care and trauma, interfacility transport, institutional response to patient deterioration, and being a part of quality initiatives in the unit. After taking boards in November 2016, he will pursue graduate studies at SU's Maxwell School.

During his time as a resident, Bob won resident teacher of the year and clinic productivity awards. As a fellow, Bob presented research at national conferences regarding the interfacility transport of neurocritically ill patients, receiving the 2014 Society of Critical Care Medicine In-Training Travel Grant for his work. Quality improvement work focused on the implementation of bedside ultrasound, co-writing a grant funding the purchase of additional equipment and the introduction and implementation of formalized curricula in critical care ultrasound. His review article regarding the use of targeted temperature management in pediatric neurologic diagnoses was just published in January and he is currently working to publish his findings regarding the epidemiology and outcomes of a large cohort of transported children with neurologic diagnoses.

On a personal note, Bob has been learning everything he missed as a pediatric resident from his son, now 2-month-old Thomas. Bob and his partner, Ismeldy, a pediatric cardiac

intensive care nurse (yes they met working

together in Pittsburgh!), have just moved in to the Pike Block apartments downtown. He



is hoping to start crossing a few things off of a growing bucket list including a desire to learn how to cross country and downhill ski (his prior experience on the slopes has been limited to snow tubing), getting back to reading some good fiction, and buying a new bicycle.
