Dr. Mason is our new Pediatric Urologist. In an exclusive interview, he tells the Crier:

I just joined the Department of Urology in August as the second Pediatric Urologist at Upstate. I'm a New York state native, having been born and raised in the Binghamton area (Endwell, NY). I did spend four years of undergrad in sunny southern California at Harvey Mudd College, but was happy to return to central NY to attend medical school here at Upstate, graduating in the class of 2008. I just spent the last seven years in the southeast, where I did my Urology residency at University of Virginia in Charlottesville and then my Pediatric Urology fellowship at Vanderbilt in Nashville, TN.

My wife, Colleen, is also from the Binghamton area, and we are both very excited to have moved back to central NY. We now live in Manlius with our 3-year-old son, Dorien, who is looking forward to some actual snow this winter, as are we all, as I snowboard and my wife skis. It is a debate between us which we will start teaching Dorien first!

I have a significant interest in teaching, and hope to get involved with the medical student curriculum as well as teach in various formats for the residents, faculty, and community physicians. I also plan to be active in clinical research here at Upstate, and have previously presented and published on many topics, with a focus on robotic surgery in children, and sacral neuromodulation for children with refractory bowel / bladder dysfunction.
