The First Hospitalist Fellow

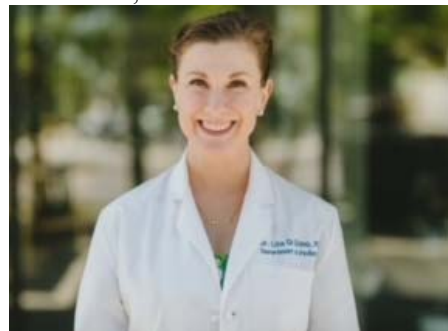

Most of us heard the tragic story of the Waukesha Christmas Parade tragedy where over 60 people were injured and 6 people died, including an 8-year-old boy. Children's Wisconsin received 18 victims from the parade tragedy, including 3 sets of siblings and the child who ultimately succumbed to his injuries. Many of the children were critically injured. In response, the Upstate Pediatric Patient Experience Team set up an opportunity for each of us to write messages of support to our colleagues at Children's Wisconsin. Each message was fixed to a "Thinking of You card, and mailed to the hospital to be distributed among their staff. Jenny Dickenson reported that we had 93 Peds staff respond to our call for messages of support.
