# FACT(2) Check

Congratulations to Dr. Brad Olson who was selected to receive the FACT2 Excellence in Instruction, State-Operated and Statutory Campuses Award. Dr. Olson will receive his award at the Conference on Instruction and Technology at SUNY Geneseo on May 27, 2015 by SUNY Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor, Dr. Alexander N. Cartwright. Dr. Olson's nominator was Dr. Ann Botash.

The Faculty Advisory Council on Teaching and Technology (FACT2) Excellence in Instruction and Excellence in Instructional Support Awards are four SUNY system-level honors conferred to acknowledge and encourage those innovative uses of technology in the teaching and learning process.

It should be noted that Dr. Olson is the creator of our Department's Online Curriculum which was one of the first of its kind, nationally. As Dr. Botash noted in her nomination letter, "The development of this curriculum involved collaboration with almost all (over 50) faculty in the department of pediatrics and, in the past two years, has collaborated with the University of California San Francisco to develop a shared comprehensive online curriculum for pediatric resident education. The curriculum is comprehensive and covers the full scope of content outlined for the American Board of Pediatrics certification exam...He has shared this curriculum with community pediatricians and Upstate Faculty for board review and gained recognition for this program through certification by the American Board of Pediatrics as a review course for Maintenance of Certification for pediatrics...He has gained further national recognition by presenting the concept and development in workshop as well as poster format at national meetings." This was a welldeserved honor for Dr. Olson.
