Welcome, Dr. Ann Botash!



The Department of Pediatrics is excited to warmly welcome our new Interim Chair, Dr. Ann Botash. Dr. Botash joined the Upstate faculty in 1990 after completing medical school, residency, and a year of general pediatric fellowship training here at Upstate. She has served as Professor and Vice Chair for Educational Affairs in the Department of Pediatrics since 2005. She was also one of the first pediatricians to be certified in child abuse pediatrics in 2009. She has worn many different hats over the years including being the pediatric clerkship director and being co-director of the pediatric residency program (along with Dr. John Andrade). She is currently the medical director of the McMahon Ryan Child Advocacy Center, director of Upstate's Child Abuse Referral and Evaluation program and is the director of the new child abuse pediatric fellowship. At Upstate, she is an inaugural member of the Academy of Upstate Educators and is the College of Medicine (COM) interprofessional education team leader. She is principal investigator on two current multi-year collaborative department of health projects: one for the Child Abuse Medical Provider Program (CHAMP) and one for rural health education, Doctors Across New York Ambulatory Care Training Program (DANY). Dr. Botash was recently honored with the State University's highest academic rank, Distinguished Teaching Professor, conferred by the State University Board of Trustees in 2017. She will continue in her role as senior associate dean for faculty affairs and development while also serving as interim chair of pediatrics. We are very excited to have her at the helm and, again, warmly welcome Dr. Botash in her new role as Interim Chair.

Welcome, J.P. Ervoes,

We are also excited to welcome and introduce our new hospitalist, Dr. John P. Ervoes to you! J.P. shared his rather boring and uneventful bio in this exclusive interview with the Crier.

“I was born and raised in Yonkers, NY, which I affectionately called the “7th Ring of Hell” (and which NYC folks called Upstate NY) but I have learned to appreciate it more as I have gotten older. I went to college initially at SUNY Albany but transferred to NYU in my second year as I missed the NYC

area and wanted to be closer to friends and family.

During the summer before my senior year of college, I spent 6 weeks in the Southeastern Amazon in indigenous territory where I: slept on a hammock (covered by a mosquito net), lived in a big hut that was built just for us, researched the attitudes towards death and dying of the Kayapo in Gorotire (the indigenous group), ate fried beetle larvae (tasted like popcorn), helped save my hut from crash and burn agriculture by pouring water all the way around it, almost fell to my death from a mountain, and thus ignited my interest in traveling. I have since traveled to Costa Rica (where I went whitewater rafting for the first time), Belize (where I went fishing for the first time and caught a barracuda on my first try), Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Portugal, Spain, Italy, and France. I am looking forward to a birthday trip to Vietnam and Cambodia with friends in May 2019.

I also enjoy tennis, racquetball, music of all genres, dancing like nobody's watching, hiking and exploring the outdoors, and I would like to learn how to ski (but after I finally get my first driver's license).

I went to the University of Pittsburgh School Of Medicine for medical school and Northwestern University in Chicago for my pediatric residency training. Thereafter, I went on a journey that would lead me to my life's true passion: Pediatric Hospitalist Medicine. I completed the first year of a Pediatric Pulmonary fellowship at Boston Children's before I decided I missed

seeing the breadth of pediatrics and wanted to pursue hospitalist medicine. I have worked in various venues since then including as a pediatric nocturnalist at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, a staff pediatrician at Kaiser in Portland, OR, and a pediatric hospitalist at Albany Medical Center and most recently at NYU. I decided on Syracuse because I felt like it was a great fit for me professionally and, although I enjoyed NYC immensely, I wanted a place where I could put down roots and eventually raise a family.”

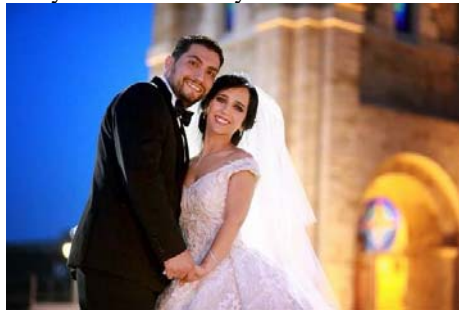
