A Feather in her CAP!


Congratulations to Stephanie Tom who was awarded a scholarship to attend the Ray E. Helfer Society 2025 Annual Meeting in April.

As we reported last month, we had several residents who had their abstracts accepted at the Pediatric Cardiology Conference at CHOP in February.




