## **Upstate In Haiti**

The 9/28 issue of Upstate Online featured an article about Upstate's collaboration with Haiti to build a sustainable village. <u>http://upstateonline.info/static/Sept28-</u> <u>Oct52017/blog/story-1/index.html</u> As exciting as that is, the Crier has gone one better with an exclusive interview with Dr. Jan Bach:

"When I returned to Upstate last year I dreamed of becoming part of Upstate's growing global health presence. This year I'm very grateful to be seeing that dream come true with two trips to Haiti in support of Upstate's Pediatric Dept and The Center for Global Heath and Translational Science. Both trips were wonderful experiences that began to build relationships and knowledge that will lend themselves to exciting opportunities.

One project I am working on is developing a resident rotation at University Hospital at Mirebalais, which is part of Zanmi Lasante, the Haitian sister organization to Boston-based Partners in Health. The goal is for Upstate to send a resident and attending team for a month long rotation in which we will teach Pediatrics to Haitian Pediatric residents and medical students. This will also offer our residents an opportunity to have a global health experience and gain insight into the challenges of health care in an underserved environment while working to develop medical resources within Haiti and aid in capacity building. I was very grateful to be able to spend time at the hospital and meet with the Pediatric Chairman and the Pediatric Residency Director, who both look forward to working with Upstate in a long term collaboration.



(Haitian Medical Students) Another exciting project that Upstate is involved with is a joint venture among multiple SUNY campuses, the Kellogg Foundation, and a number of other not-forprofits to develop a "Sustainable Village & Learning Community" or "SVLC" on a 40 acre site along the Haitian coast. The SVLC has many integrated sectors, all of which share the goal of learning through development and building capacity on many levels. For Upstate, our contribution is within the "Health and Wellness working group". This group is working to develop a clinic within the SVLC in which Haitian medical providers would promote quality care and wellness with support through SUNY educational resources. At the same time the SVLC would also work with local health care facilities to provide training and build resources throughout the region.

While both of these endeavors may seem to be off in the distance, I know they will bring wonderful opportunities for Upstate and our Pediatric Dept to both further resident growth and serve others. Is there a better combination? I'm confident 2018 will see our first resident rotation to Haiti, a country with a rich and dynamic history defined not just by poverty, natural disaster, and lack of resources. These days I can bend an ear for quite a while on the topic of our projects and the awesome people I've met so far. Feel free to grab me anytime if you want to learn more!"
