This year's conference was organized by Dr.Brown from URMC, while next year's will be a joint effort between Dr. Wali and former chief resident Dr. Mohanty (now a pediatric GI attending in Rochester). Topics discussed included providing nutritional support topediatric GI patients post-discharge, Omegaven a fatty acid emulsion used forTPN, fecal transplantation, and two case reports. The first report discussed a patient with primary sclerosing cholangitis. The second case and last talk of the day was given by Upstate MS4 Caroline Kirby, who presented on a patient with dysphagia. She did a fantastic job!

The annual conference was a great way to learn about interesting and new topics in pediatric Gastroenterology, and it is highly recommended to anyone interested in the field!
