Welcome Dr. Andrew Osten

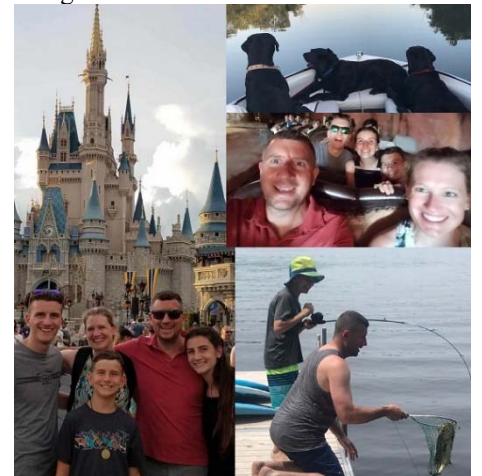

It’s Destiny

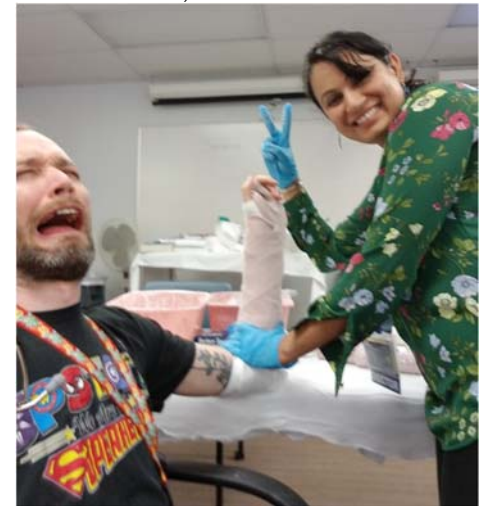
