





MEDICATION ACTION STEPS...

TO PREVENT POISONING!

- 1. Always read and follow the instructions on the label for all medicines you use.
- 2. Keep all medicine in the bottle/jar it came in with its label.
- 3. Put all medicine away after each use. Be sure it is out of the sight and reach of children.
- 4. Don't share prescription medicine as it can act as a poison if used by the wrong person, in the wrong way or in the wrong amount.
- 5. When finished or when a medication is stopped, safely get rid of any extra medicine from your home:
 - a. In Onondaga County, take it to a medicine drop box at your local Police Station or at the pharmacy at University Hospital.
 - b. Though the med box is the best way, if you can't get to a med box, mix the medicine with used coffee grounds and then throw the mix into the trash.
- 6. Don't tell children in your care that medicine is candy as it makes them want to take it when you are not looking.
- 7. Know that for some, opioid medicines can be addictive.
