She is co-director of The Institute on Movement Studies for Individuals with Visual Impairments or Deafblindness (IMSVI) (www.brockport.edu/IMSVI). She is the founder and director of Camp Abilities: An educational sports camp for children with visual impairments. Camp Abilities has been replicated in 20 states and eight countries (www.campabilities.org and www.campabilitiesworld.com). Most recently she has been awarded a Global Fulbright Scholarship to promote Camp Abilities world-wide.

David Marino is the Founder and Executive Director of Eye Got This Inc. a small nonprofit promoting physical activity, running and guide runner training for visually impaired athletes. David is also the Senior Director of Access & Ability at the YMCA of Central New York which seeks to ensure inclusive programming for all abilities at the YMCA. A visually impaired athlete himself David refuses to give up being physically active and continues to enjoy running, lifting, kayaking, biking and more.



Megan Hale is a student at SUNY Brockport studying Physical Education with plans to go into the Adapted Physical Education concentration. She has been participating in sports since she was little. She used to be a camper at Camp Abilities and is now a coach at Camp Abilities. She has been working with Russ Myer and the Trail Orienteering crew for a year now. She works as a ViB Inclusion Coordinator to verify the trails and make sure they are accessible for blind users.

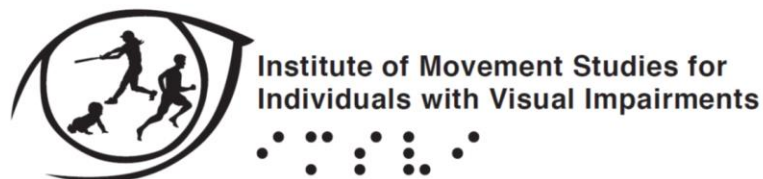
