The event celebrated the many successes of the United Way of CNY in their advocacy of many CNY organizations over the century.

Arel Moodie, A time to learn, network, connect and laugh!

Social networking is key to any emerging leader and a core value of the Upstate ELU group. Arel Moodie, author, host of Disney+ show 'Family Reboot' and keynote speaker of the United Way event held at Sky Armory in October 2022, highlights the impact of networking in his talk.

The idea of an in-person social networking event can feel a bit unfamiliar in a post-pandemic world. As you enter a room, the thoughts that pervade your mind include, "did I bring a mask", "how close do I sit to people", "are we hand shaking or fist bumping as a greeting." You could feel the hesitations as people walked into the room, of the event titled "Get in the Bunker: How a simple strategy can unlock the power within your community." For many professionals who are part of the ELU and Women United membership this is one of their first in-person social networking events hosted by the CNY United Way since 2019.

Arel didn't waste time breaking the ice with inviting attendees to sit closer and meet someone new. This simple request was the catalyst for an event full of laughs, inspiring and perspective reflections on how you can make a difference in your communities.

Key takeaways include:

- ⇒ **Get Social**: Arel shared that most of us have that internal dialogue where you hesitate to go to social events, you find chores or assignments that suddenly take priority. He highlights how in those moments of hesitations to choose being social because what you get in return is immeasurable.
- ⇒ **Explore New Perspectives**: Arel shared a story of a hungry lion, her cub and a zebra to showcase perspective. If you are the lion or the zebra you have a perspective of why you keep showing up and 'fighting' he encourages us to take a moment to consider others struggles and perspective before making decisions.
- ⇒ Stay Active in Your Community: Arel shared a touching personal story of how programs supported by the United Way helped him and his family as he grew up in NYC. He demonstrated simple ways in which you could support local community organizations and programs, highlighting the important work of the United Way.
- ⇒ **Be Prepared**: Always have an arsenal of dad jokes to break the ice of a crowd of stiff professionals. Arel shared a variety of 'dad' jokes to get the audience relaxed. As the talk progressed the smiles and belly laughs grew creating an abundant of positive energy in the room.

The group will be responsible for creating the meal plan, purchasing food, and preparing the meal. Aprons are available on site and we encourage members to bring any supplies they might need. Of course safety is a priority so gloves, clean hands, hair coverings/ties, and subs if you are ill are required.

With over 50% of their guests from Upstate, Sarah's Guest house supports those in need with

low to no cost housing during their treatment or visits. Upstate has supported them in the past as the 2022 Your Cause recipient and will continue to support them in the future. The Emerging Leaders are happy to give them a homecooked meal as part of our volunteering.
